Dear Sir:

This letter is written by one of your ardent supporters from the time you were nominated for Governor of this state until February 18, 1935.

It appears you had the opportunity to write your name as high in the ranks of able jurists of the Supreme Court as that of John Marshall and others.

It appears the members of the Court rendering the controlling decision did not take into consideration the "emergency" and "damages" already sustained by the vast army of thrifty middle class citizens who can prove acute damages from the experiment of devalued money and repudiation of contracts. Many have neither the inclination nor funds to press their claims. However this class pays the bulk of the taxes and are the warp which holds together the fabric of the nation. Moreover, they are not responsible for the "emergency" of this depression.

Broadly speaking, the decision gives encouragement and license for further invasion against the rights of the people who are unable to resist the present power of control. They had looked to the Judicial branch of our government for protection.
