My dear Mr. President:

I received a letter from Senator ^{Joseph} O'Mahoney enclosing a copy of S. 3072. This is the bill for Federal Licensing, etc. etc., recently introduced in the Senate by Senators O'Mahoney and Borah. Senator O'Mahoney informs me that a Sub-Committee to consider the matter has been appointed, which Sub-Committee is made up as follows:

Senators King, Van-Nuys, Logan, Hatch, Borah, Norris, Austin and O'Mahoney.

In his letter to me Senator O'Mahoney says

"The Committee would be greatly indebted for an expression of your views not only with respect to the principle of the bill but also with respect to its details."

I am causing a study and analysis of the bill to be made so that I shall be in a position to discuss the matter with the Sub-Committee when the time comes. Prior to that time I shall hope to have a conference with you dealing with this general subject.
