

Dear Chief:

Since Bill Brennan has quoted to you my feelings in regard to withholding until the New York Exchange closes announcement of an opinion which there may be good reason to believe would feverishly affect the market, I should like to say, not at all with a view of further arguing the question, that it would not depart from tradition to do this. On the contrary, it would accord with tradition, as I was authoritatively informed on the matter before I came to the Court.
