I am a non-exchange member firm and it would appear to me that the application of policies which are outlined in this article would tend to eventually make it impossible for me to compete on any reasonable basis with member firms.

I employ approximately 60 people in my organization and sell only Mutual Fund shares. Therefore, I have no need to become a member of an exchange. No doubt you will agree that there is a place for a business such as mine and that there is a place for Mutual Funds for those people who are not adept at managing and selecting their own stocks.

I heartily solicit your consideration for the establishment of policies and procedures which would permit free enterprise and small business efforts, such as ours, to continue in the investment field.
