Attached is a folder of biographical background on the three Congressmen you are scheduled to meet with tomorrow.

I anticipate that Chairman Dingell will be interested in the following:

- The SEC is an independent agency and should not listen to OMB

- He doesn't think much of economists and they should not be the final word in SEC rulemaking.

- He will probably want to discuss Edgar

- He may want to discuss the NY Regional office situation

- In the takeover area, he may be interested in one-share one vote and preemption.

I talked with his counsel, Consuela Washington, this afternoon. She advises that she has not yet discussed this meeting with him (she will advise me of any concerns she is alerted to), and she hopes the meeting will actually occur because things have been hectic and he had to cancel his entire schedule yesterday.
