### Virtual Museum and Programs

- A 1964 videotaped interview with Carman Blough, the first SEC Chief Accountant, has been digitized for inclusion in the museum. The tape was loaned by the Accounting History Videotape Library at the University of Mississippi, through the work of the Chief Accountant's Office committee.
- Nancy Garrett Worcester, daughter of Ray Garrett, Jr., has shared introductions to speeches made by her father in 1974 and 1975.
- On April 15<sup>th</sup>, the Society in partnership with the Museum of American Financial History and the National Council on Economic Education – presented "Self Regulation and the Exchanges from an Historical Perspective." William Brodsky, Alger Chapman, Gordon Macklin, William Morton and Donald Stone were the panelists. 160 persons – 75 in New York City and another 85 listening in live online – attended the program.
- The April 20<sup>th</sup> fireside chat on municipal securities, sponsored by The Bond Market Association, with Michael McCarthy of The Bond Market Foundation and Christopher Taylor of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, attracted a live audience of 207.
- The invitations to the June 2<sup>nd</sup> Roundtable of SEC Chairmen, the June 2<sup>nd</sup> Commission dinner, and the June 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Meeting were mailed.
- The National Economic Research Associates, Inc. (NERA) has scheduled its "best of conference" online program for July 27<sup>th</sup>. Theresa Gabaldon of The George Washington University School of Law will be the moderator.
- The final fireside chat for 2004 focusing on the regulation of clearance and settlement will take place on November 11<sup>th</sup>. Richard Nesson of The Depository Trust and Clearing Corporation, and Anthony Nuland of Seward & Kissel LLP will be the panelists.
